OUR ORGANISATION

Skylight Mental Health (Skylight) is a community-based, not-for-profit organisation, which provides a range of education, support, rehabilitation and recovery-oriented services and programs for people with mental illness, their carers (family and friends) and the community. Skylight delivers programs using 'lived experience' of people with mental illness and carers, and according to a psychosocial rehabilitation model, and recovery philosophy and practice.

Skylight's objectives include promoting greater community knowledge, awareness, support and understanding of the effects of mental illness on individuals and their carers. Skylight pursues these objectives through research, illness management, support, reducing stigma and advancing the rights of people with a mental illness and their carers. Skylight is a member organisation of MIFA (Mental Illness Fellowship Australia, www.mifa.org.au), a national body with branches across states and territories in Australia. Skylight programs deliver a range of recovery-oriented community mental health services by working alongside people experiencing mental illness, family and friends who support them, and the broader general South Australian community. Skylight develops programs with input from participants, to ensure responsive, effective services that build on strengths, increase resilience and improve mental health.

Services include individual support, carer programs, therapeutic groups, social and recreational activities, together with information, education, advice and referral. The Community Mental Health Worker will perform one or more of these services.

Under the general direction of a supervisor, the Community Mental Health Worker will assist in the development, delivery and evaluation of high quality Skylight programs. The Community Mental Health Worker will contribute to a collaborative and flexible team culture, to build and maintain respectful and compassionate relationships with program participants. This will include working closely with community partner organisations and key stakeholders in a range of locations, including Skylight sites, community centres, local community settings, within people's homes and residential group accommodation.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The Community Mental Health Worker position may require flexible work hours. Flexible work hours are subject to the needs of the program, as negotiated, with time off in lieu provided by mutual agreement when the employee works additional hours, to maintain an average of allocated hours per week.

DHS Working With Children check and Disability Clearance are required prior to appointment. You must hold a Permanent Resident Visa or be an Australian Citizen to apply for this position.

The Community Mental Health Worker will be required to use their own registered, insured and fully maintained motor vehicle and will receive compensation for mileage at the Award rate.

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DUTIES

- Assist in the development, delivery and evaluation of a range of recovery oriented community mental health services (individual and/or group) by working alongside people experiencing mental illness, family and friends who support them, and the broader general South Australian community.
- Utilise and implement principles and culturally competent practices based on National Standards for Mental Health Services.
- Provide responsive effective services, which build on strengths, increase resilience and improve mental health for example involving carers, assisting in the development of independent living skills and encouraging community participation.
- Assist people to navigate the NDIS, through the provision of Support Coordination services.
- Support and supervise staff, students and volunteers in the delivery of services. This includes a focus on practice, general support and administration.
- Manage customer relationships.
- Implement appropriate crisis intervention and risk assessment processes.
- Contribute to a collaborative and flexible team culture.
- Ensure that a high level of documentation and data is maintained, within a timely manner from all aspects of service delivery.
- Utilise and implement principles and culturally competent practices, based on National Standards for Mental Health Services.
- Network and work closely with community partner organisations and key stakeholders.
- Contribute to the progress of Skylight's Reconciliation Action Plan.
- Develop and implement resources, policies, and processes.
- Maintain current mental health knowledge, and engage in regular supervision and annual performance appraisals to ensure ongoing professional development.
- Contribute to the high standard of service that Skylight provides by participating in relevant meetings, delivering programs consistent with Skylight's strategic plan, policies and procedures, and participating in continuous quality improvement activities.
- Plan, develop and implement special projects and events as directed by the CEO or delegate to meet specific and identified needs. This may include working within or alongside other Skylight programs/work areas on occasion to achieve Skylight's strategic goals.

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SELECTION CRITERIA

Skills, Knowledge and Experience

- A tertiary qualification relevant to the health or mental health sector, and or extensive experience in the community services sector.
- Registration with AASW, ACA, PACFA or similar body desirable.
- Demonstrated skills in one or more of the following areas: NDIS Support Coordination, individual support, carer programs, therapeutic groups, social and recreational activities, provision of information, education, advice and referral.
- Demonstrated ability to apply National Standards for Mental Health Services and culturally competent practices.
- Knowledge of the NDIS desirable.
- Excellent organisational skills including attention to detail. Highly effective oral and written communication skills as well as interpersonal skills.
- Demonstrated excellent teamwork and willingness to take on new challenges.
- Strong personal and interpersonal skills, open to continuous personal development and responsive to feedback.
- Current SA Driver's License and willingness to use own registered, insured (at a minimum Third Party Property Damage Insurance) and fully maintained motor vehicle for work purposes.
- Strong working knowledge of, and experience with, Microsoft Office, customer relationship management (CRM) databases, scheduling software, email and internet.
- Current Introduction to First Aid and Child Safe Environment accreditation (or willingness to obtain).
